### 56 Newfoundland and Labrador community service organizations receive \$2,670,545 through the Government of Canada's Community Services Recovery Fund

August 30, 2023 [St. John's, NL] - Today, the Community Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador and United Way of Newfoundland and Labrador are pleased to announce \$2,670,545 in funding to support 56 organizations in Newfoundland and Labrador through the Government of Canada's Community Services Recovery Fund. The Community Services Recovery Fund is a one-time investment of \$400 million to help community service organizations (charities, non-profits, Indigenous governing bodies) adapt, modernize and be better equipped to improve the efficacy, accessibility and sustainability of the community services that they provide through the pandemic recovery and beyond.

Below is a full list of projects being supported through the Community Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador and the United Way of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Community service organizations are at the forefront of addressing communities' needs. Since the early phases of the COVID-19 pandemic, they have struggled with increased demand for their services, reduced revenues, declines in charitable giving due to the rising cost of living, and a greater need to make use of digital tools. Many organizations are struggling to recover and adapt their services to the changing needs in Newfoundland and Labrador.

"Community service organizations are at the heart of communities like those across Newfoundland and Labrador, creating a sense of belonging from coast to coast to coast. The Community Services Recovery Fund will enable organizations, like those listed, that serve our diverse communities to adapt and modernize their programs and services and to invest in the future of their organizations, staff and volunteers. Together, we can rebuild from the isolation of the COVID-19 pandemic and build a more just and equitable future for those in Newfoundland and Labrador."

This change allowed us to fundraise and invest those funds throughout the entire province. We are a LOCAL organization that provides funding and support to charities and programs throughout Newfoundland and Labrador through our Community Fund grants. To date, we have invested over \$7.2 Million dollars to charities through our community fund right here at home since 2005 and over \$2.4 Million to other registered charities through our donor choice service!
